



ATV Rodeo Rules

1. The Judge at the start of the event will raise his hand to start your turn, and time.
2. The Judge at the Finish will raise his hand to end your turn, and time.
3. No Alcohol will be allowed on the premises; anyone intoxicated or under the influence will be escorted off the premises.
4. When registering for events, the individual must select their class and age group. The judges reserve the right and may place participants in a class they feel is best for fair competition.
5. We reserve the right to combine competition classes, in the event of a lack of entries per class, to keep prize winning fair. The number of participants in each class is at the discretion of the judges.
6. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated. Any display of unacceptable behavior, decided by the judges, will result in a disqualification. If the conduct continues, the participant or spectator may be escorted off the premises.
7. Participants and all ATV riders are required to wear a proper fitting, DOT certified helmet any time the ATV is in motion. Penalties will be enforced, and to be decided by the judges.
8. A five second (5) penalty will be applied for each occurrence where it applies to the event: Tipping a Barrel or pole, breaking the chalk line barrier, and other rules as defined by the judges.
9. All participants agree to compete in a fair manner and follow all rules.

ATV Mud Bog Rules:

1. Judge at start line raises his hand to start your run.
2. Judge at finish line raises his hand to end your run.
3. Time starts when the first judge raises their hand and runs until the second judge raises their hand.
4. Rider is responsible for hooking rope to his/her quad. Rider accepts responsibility for all damages caused while being pulled from the pit.
5. No alcohol is allowed in the pit while the mud bogs are in progress.
6. Distance is measured from the front of the ATV tires.
7. An ATV must move at least it's own length to have a valid run. If it does not move it's own length from the start line it will be restarted. If the ATV does not make it's own length a second time it is disqualified.
8. No riding the sides of pits. If any tire goes out of the pit you will be sent back to the start line, and must restart your run. Time will not be restarted.
9. Rider must remain properly mounted on the ATV at all times during the run. The only time a rider is allowed to dismount his ATV during a run is if the ATV is rolling over, rider is then allowed to catch his bike and maintain control. If a rider dismounts and the throttle is pressed they will be disqualified.
10. When registering you must choose your class. If you choose a class that your bike does not belong in we reserve the right to put you in the class we feel you belong.
11. Judges of the competition reserve the right to combine competition classes, in the event of too few entries per class. The number of participants needed to continue with a class competition is at the discrepancy of the judges; they will decide whether to continue with a class competition after registration ends and before the competitions begin.
12. Unsportsmanlike -like conduct will not be tolerated. Any participant displaying unacceptable behavior will be disqualified from the competition and may be removed from the event.
13. All participants for the Race class are required to wear helmets. If a competitor signs up for this class and don't have a helmet or cannot borrow one they will be disqualified from this class.
14. The judge reserves the right to change the rules. These rule changes will be due to conditions of the mud pit, number of racers, and time issues. All rule changes will be announced before the start of the bog.
